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## COVID-19 UPDATE



Our buildings closed to the public on March 16. Since then, our employees have been busy making improvements to the building, signing up new card holders, launching new online programs, adding to our ebook collection, and helping patrons via email and phone.

At this time (June 1), we do not have a firm reopening date. Gov. Lamont has announced that public libraries can reopen starting on June 20, but we are waiting to make sure that our buildings will be safe for both the public and our employees before we reopen. Please note that there will be significant changes to our operations when we do reopen. More information will be available soon.

Senior citizens who need help with prescription pick up and/or drop off, emergency transportation, supplemental food drop off, or other issues can call the City of Waterbury at 311 to request assistance. Anyone with questions about the city's ongoing response to COVID-19 can also call 311 for more information.

### WI-FI



The Wi-Fi at the library on Grand Street remains on, even while the building is closed. You can pick up the Wi-Fi signal while sitting on the lawn or benches in front of the library, on the back patio, or in your car while parked on Grand Street. Look for SBL-WiFi-hotspot. No password is needed.

### DUE DATES



All due dates have been extended to June 30. We will begin accepting returns to the bin in front of either the main library or branch library starting June 1, but you are welcome to keep what you have until after we reopen. No late fees will be charged for any items currently checked out of the library.

## CHROMEBOOKS AND HOTSPOTS

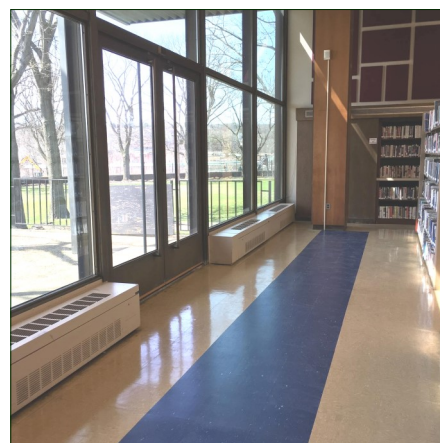
Thanks to funding from the federal CARES Act and the Institute of Museum & Library Services, the Connecticut State Library will be providing us with Chrome books and Wi-Fi hotspots which we will be able to loan out to our patrons. We will send out detailed information when they are ready to be borrowed.



## BUILDING IMPROVEMENTS

New study areas have been created along the windows in the Main Reading Room. Thanks to a grant from the Connecticut State Library and the Institute for Museum & Library Services, new chairs will replace the old, mismatched chairs on the first floor.

We are making a number of physical changes to reduce the risk of contagion when our buildings reopen. Plexiglas barriers are being installed at the public service desks; public computers have been repositioned to comply with social distancing; seating will be reconfigured to comply with social distancing; and touchless hand sanitizer dispensers are being installed in several locations.



Our maintainers have done a deep cleaning of the building. Tile floors have been scrubbed and waxed, carpets have been shampooed, and fresh paint has gone up in several locations. When we reopen our buildings, all shared surfaces will be disinfected repeatedly throughout the day.

## CT 3D PRINT ARMY

In March, we started using our 3D printer to make frames for face shields to help supply area hospitals and other medical facilities in dire need of PPEs. We converted one of our book return bins for use as a 3D printing drop-off site for the hundreds of other groups and individuals participating in this project, which was named the CT 3D Print Army.

Our buildings are closed, but there's more to a library than the building it's in.

## EBOOKS & AUDIOBOOKS

We have increased our collection of online books, both ebooks and downloadable audiobooks. You can access them for free with the barcode number on your library card.

You can adjust an ebook's font size, book layout, and lighting. As you read, you can also add bookmarks, create notes and highlights, and define words.

For audiobooks, you can skip backward or forward, increase playback speed up to 3x, and set a sleep timer until the end of the chapter or for 5, 10, 30 minutes, or more.

The Libby app connects you to our OverDrive collection of ebooks and audiobooks on your smartphone or tablet.



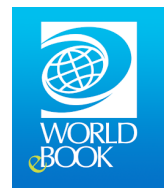
## SIMPLYE

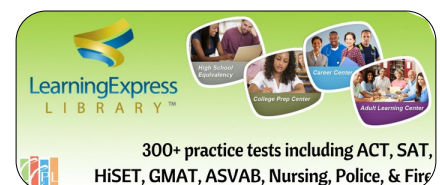

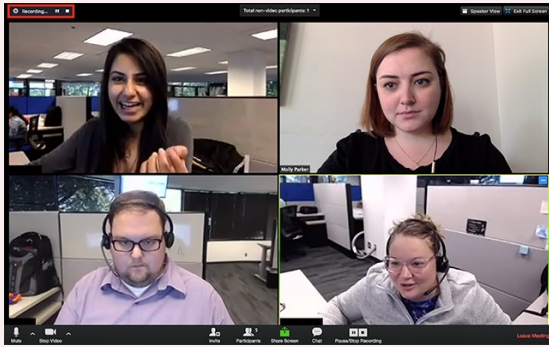

## HOW IT WORKS

1. You must register for each program by visiting our website, [bronsonlibrary.org](http://bronsonlibrary.org), or by calling 203-574-8225 (leave a message with your name and phone number if we don't answer).
2. After you register for the program, you will receive the information you need to join the Zoom session when it starts.
3. You can join the session by either clicking the link in the email we send you, or by calling the designated phone number and entering the code number we provided to you.

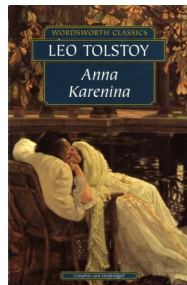

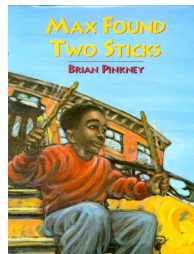

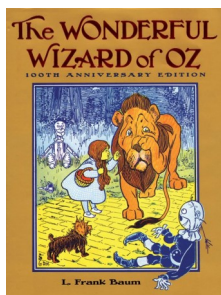
## ONE READ: THE WONDERFUL WIZARD OF OZ
