Calvary Cemetery has been in operation from around 1800 to the present. Catholic, governed by the Archdiocese of Hartford. Facilities include a chapel, columbarium and mausoleum. Records are housed on-site; searches by office personnel only.

### East Farms Cemetery

#### 3156 East Main Street

This historic cemetery dates from the Revolutionary War era. (see article in Republican American, 10/16/2014, pg. 1 and 11A – includes historical information and photographs of East Farms Cemetery) Records are located at the Secretary's residence, 128 Joseph St., Waterbury, CT 06705; searches by appointment. #### Fort Hill Cemetery

#### Thomaston Avenue, Waterville

The location of many Memorial Day observances, this is the final resting place of many veterans who served in various wars. The cemetery was in use between 1832 and 1945. (see article in Republican American, 5/28/2000, p. 4B.

Town Cemetery
