

NEWS FROM THE LIBRARY

The Silas Bronson Library is pleased to participate in this year's Black History Month city-wide celebration. In addition to programs being offered at the Library, the Waterbury Celebrates Black History Month flyer (which can be picked up at the Circulation Desk or downloaded from our website) includes events being held throughout the city.

You're in for a special treat this month with our featured artist, Enrique Ortiz, a Dominican immigrant, Waterbury resident, and culinary artist extraordinaire! Examples of his sculpture will be on view in our gallery and display cases, and Ortiz will present a demonstration of his craft on February 20. Ortiz has won numerous awards for his culinary creations and recognition from the White House and the Vatican.

Volunteers from AARP will be at the Library every Tuesday from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. to assist seniors and low income residents with their tax preparation and filing. The program starts February 2 and continues through April 12.

We've introduced some improvements to patron services recently. 


