Luca is Coming!!!! Luca Is Coming!!!

Luca Manfé, winner of *MasterChef*! Season 4 Competition will give a book talk and signing of his new book. "My Italian Kitchen: Favorite Family Recipes from the Winner of MasterChef Season 4 on FOX" in the Main Reading Room. Monday, June 2 at 6:30 p.m. The opportunity to author a cookbook was one of the prizes of the competition – along with \$250,000 and a trophy.

The tv program is hosted by 15-time Michelin award-winning master chef Gordon

Ramsey who judges the competition along with master chefs Joe Bastianich and Graham Elliot.

In the book, which was just released on May 13<sup>th</sup>, the Italian-born chef shares recipes passed down from his "nonnas" (grandmothers) that reflect the warm, rustic flavors of Friuli, Italy - rich frico, risotto, and savory polenta. Manfé states "I also love the lighter bites, perfect with a glass of wine: crostini with ricotta and honey, or a tramezzini, the Italian version of English high-tea sandwiches. " And he didn't forget the sweets—from the tiramisu he made with my mother when he was eight years old to the famous basil panna cotta that helped him win the MasterChef title.

Luca shares the fundamentals of fantastic Italian food, including homemade stock, pasta from scratch, and more. *My Italian Kitchen* is packed with recipes of his favorite foods plus some good behind-the-scenes stories from Season 4 of *MasterChef*!)

The public is invited. Admission and evening parking are free.




