MENTAL HEALTH MONTH 2

May is Mental Health Month

The library will be observing Mental Health Month Wednesday, May 28 with a lecture by Cynthia D. Conrad, MD, PhD entitled "Commonly occurring conditions that could affect any of

us: What they are, how to recognize them, and how - and where - to get help" in the library auditorium at 6:30 p.m.

Dr. Conrad, who is Medical Director of the Western Connecticut Mental Health Network, notes that there are a number of conditions that affect a high percentage of the population that may be hard to recognize. Among them are depression, mood disorder, anxiety disorders and mild cognitive losses. Unfortunately, many people who generally take good care of their physical health and would never hesitate to go to the doctor for a sprained ankle or the flu, hesitate to seek help with behavioral problems, fearing that there is a stigma attached. Dr. Conrad's talk will serve as an opportunity not only to increase one's general knowledge of mental health concerns, but also to ask questions either publicly or privately.

Born in Waterbury, Dr. Conrad received her undergraduate degree from Connecticut College (magna cum laude), her medical degree from the University of

North Carolina School of Medicine (with Honors) and her Ph.D. from University of North Carolina. She is an award-winning educator and psychiatrist who currently is a Lecturer in Psychiatry at Yale School of Medicine and is an Adjunct Assistant Professor of Health Sciences at the University of Bridgeport, Physician Assistant Institute.


There is no greater suffering than carrying the weight of an untold offense.

Meet Latoya McPherson, author of *Scars That Never Heal*, an account of a woman who kept secret her abuse and an attempted sexual assault by a relative. Emotionally scarred by her mother's behavior and a recurring nightmare of the childhood incident, she discusses her life-

time of hurt, tears, and forgiveness as she desperately seeks to heal the wounds of her past.

Latoya McPherson provides healing solutions to experiences, such as abuse, adoption, the loss of a loved one, and divorce, that leave some people psychologically scarred. Drawing from discussions and research, she offers biblical scriptures as well as practical suggestions for recovery from emotional scars. The Waterbury native who is an accountant and administrator for the state, an entrepreneur and a college educator, also provides clear explanations about generational curses, healing, forgiveness, and much more.
