The Silas Bronson Library will celebrate Italian Heritage Month with four special programs beginning with **poet** and playwright Maria Sassi's presentation of some of her Italian- inspired poetry as well as poetry from her forthcoming book *Rare Grass* at the Calling All Poets ( . . . . and

poetry lovers) program. The program's theme will be "Family Heritage".

Ms. Sassi's earlier works include *What I See*, a folio/chapbook of ekphrastic prize-winning poems and her book *"Rooted In Stars", now in its second printing,* which is in the permanent collection of Yale University's Beinecke Rare Book & Manuscript Library.

Ms. Sassi has conducted poetry workshops for nine years at the University of Hartford and is a recent recipient of an Artist Fellowship from the Connecticut Commission on the Arts. She was the Poet Laureate of West Hartford and hosts readings there at the Noah Webster House. She feels deeply about poetry and its refined saving grace of our language, our life.

### Mary Donnarumma Sharnick Book Talk & Signing




A Book Talk and Signing by Mary Donnarumma Sharnick will take place Tuesday, Oct. 7<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. Ms. Sharnick will present her latest novel Plagued, the story of Michael of Rhodes,

who, as a 16-year-old, became an oarsman of the Venetian fleet in the plague-ridden 15<sup>th</sup> century. The book is Ms. Sharnick's second on Venice. Her first, *Thirst*, is being adapted for the operatic stage. Ms. Sharnick's work has appeared in such journals as America, Italian Americana, The New York Journal of Books, and Southern Humanities Review. She teaches writing at Chase Collegiate School where she chairs the English Department. She and her husband also organize "slow travel" tours of Italy, which she considers her second home.

### 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Tribute to Luciano Pavarotti



concert will take place Saturday, October 11<sup>th</sup> in the Main Reading Room at 3:00 p.m., featuring Juan Carlos Franco, a finalist in the Luciano Pavarotti International Voice Competition. As such, the Colombian-born tenor enjoyed the



opportunity of being both critiqued and coached by the maestro who died in 2007. Franco will share with the audience some his remembrances of Pavarotti. A highly accomplished tenor, Franco is the first of the series' tenors to sing Pavarotti's signature aria, "Nessun Dorma" from Giacomo Puccini's opera Turandot.




This year's program will replicate a little more than 60% of Pavarotti's September, 2000 concert at Madison Square Garden, closing with "Non ti scordar de me" (Don't forget me), sung in memory of Pavarotti, whose birthday is October 12<sup>th</sup>. Soprano Marissa



Famiglietti and pianist Joseph Jacovino, Jr., both very talented and popular Waterburians, will also perform.

Storyteller Lou Del Bianco portrays his grandfather Luigi Del Bianco, master carver of Mount Rushmore in a 40-minute general audience program entitled In the Shadow of the Mountain Tuesday, Oct 21st in the library auditorium at 6:30 p.m. Del Bianco uses authentic photos, maps and timelines to bring his grandfather's story to life!

Actor, singer and storyteller, Del Bianco has been performing for adults and children of all ages since 1982. According to The

New York Times, his dramatic approach to storytelling "puts pow into passivity!" He has performed various roles, including Abraham Lincoln, throughout the country, including Carnegie Hall. His six recordings have garnered high praise from Billboard Magazine, Parent's Choice, Booklist, Child Magazine, Family Fun and others.

Beverly Jenkins is the nation's premier writer of African-American historical romance fiction, having published over thirty novels. She is the recipient of five Waldenbooks/Borders Group Best Sellers Awards, two Career Achievement Awards and a Pioneer Award from Romantic Times Magazine; and a Golden Pen Award from the Black Writer's Guild. She was named one of the Top Fifty Favorite African-American writers of the 20th Century in1999 by AABLC, the nation's largest on-line African-American book club.

Ms. Jenkins has been featured in numerous publications and has lectured at such prestigious universities as Oberlin University, the University of Illinois, and Princeton and was the featured speaker at the 2014 W.W. Law Lecture Series sponsored by the Savannah Black Heritage Festival.

Bring on the Blessings, her first faith-based novel was published in 2009. The fourth book in the Blessings series: A Wish and A Prayer was nominated for a 2013 NAACP Image Award. Copies of Destiny's Captive, Heart of God and A Wish and a *Prayer* will be available for purchase at reduced, tax-free prices.
