# Front Plaza Project

The construction project started on April 4 with a "substantial completion" schedule of 120 days and a "final completion" schedule of 150 days. The first part of the project will be the construction of a temporary handicap ramp for the rear patron entrance. There may be modifications to those doors to facilitate handicap access (the construction team will be examining the doors to see what the options are).

The current plan is to fence off the entire east side of the front lawn, from the corner of the west wing of the building all the way to the driveway for the parking lot and all the way to the sidewalk along Grand Street. The fencing will remain in place for the duration of the project. The fenced-in area will be off-limits to anyone not involved in the construction (hard hat zone). This means that the front entrance will not be usable during the construction period. We will need to relocate the front entrance book drop, trash can, etc. to the rear entrance when the fencing is installed.

# FY18 Budget

The Mayor has presented the City's proposed budget for FY18 to the Board of Aldermen. I will be discussing my allocation request with the Aldermen on April 27. There were only two major cuts to my request: the elimination of a new staff position of Development/PR Specialist and a reduction to the "book" budget.

In order to maintain existing service levels for the public, our "book budget" (which includes online databases, DVDs, and other patron resources) needs to be \$237,550. The Mayor's proposed budget reduces this to \$195,000, a difference of \$42,550.

#### **Benevento Fund**

The Philip V. Benevento Fund for Cultural Programs for Adults has been established with the Friends of the Silas Bronson Library through a generous donation by MacDermid Performance Solutions and their C.O.O. Frank Monteiro. MacDermid's initial donation to the fund was \$10,000 with an additional \$2,500 for the inaugural year. Semina DeLaurentis is arranging the inaugural performance, to be held in the Main Reading Room on June 8 at 6 p.m. In addition, we have sent out a solicitation letter to a group of supporters in the hopes that we will be able to match the initial \$10,000 donation. The goal is to grow the fund so that the interest revenue may be used in perpetuity to support cultural programs for adults at the library.
