150 YEARS OF THE SILAS BRONSON LIBRARY

Silas Bronson grew up in Waterbury and went on to become a wealthy merchant in New York City. When he died in 1867, he left \$200,000 to the City of Waterbury

for the creation of a public library, "for the promotion of education and intelligence and general information of the inhabitants of the City of Waterbury."

The Silas Bronson Library, named for its founding benefactor, opened on April 1, 1870, with a collection of 11,500 books. Patrons were not allowed to browse the shelves; they had to request books which would then be fetched for them. During our first year, more than 3,000 people signed up to use the library. Patrons were limited to borrowing one book at a time and had to pay a \$5 security deposit to borrow books.

The first library building was a storefront facing the Green on West Main Street. A new building was constructed on Grand Street in 1893, with enough room for 220,000 books. The current library building was constructed during the 1960s, replacing the 1890s building.

Today, our collection has approximately 277,000 physical books, audiobooks, movies, music, and magazines, plus thousands more eBooks and online learning resources. Approximately 25,000 Waterbury residents have library cards and visit the main library and the Bunker Hill branch library more than 225,000 times each year.
