

## SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 2015 ADMISSION IS FREE.

The honorees were selected by a board-appointed committee and confirmed by the library Board of Agents. The inductees are the following:



**Timothy Porter**, a deacon in the Baptist church, who hosted anti-slavery meetings and helped escaped slaves on their journey to freedom in Canada, using his home as an Underground Railroad stop.

**John Miles Stocking**, a deacon in the Congregational church, who was an abolitionist active in the Underground Railroad, using his barn as a resting station for escaped slaves.



**Dr. Frederick LaBrecque**, founder of St. Mary's Hospital obstetrics/ gynecology department, president of the Waterbury Medical Association and the New England Society for Obstetrics and Gynecology, and winner of the *Republican-American's* annual "Baby Derby", delivering over 12,000 Waterbury babies.

Nicholas P. Augelli, Crosby High School basketball coach since 1970, whose teams have won three state championships. He's had the most wins in the city, and is second in the Naugatuck Valley League. He has been president of the Board of Aldermen, served on the finance and fire boards, and the police commission, but he cherishes most the title "coach".



Donna Palomba, whose sexual assault in 1993 and harsh treatment by the Waterbury Police resulted in her founding "Jane Doe No More" a non-profit agency which trains police officers in appropriate policies and procedures, and aids rape victims.

Sheryl Lee Ralph, who, as one of the original Broadway "Dream Girls" was nominated for a Tony Award for Best Actress in a Musical, is a star of stage, screen and television as well as a highly dedicated AIDS advocate and a dynamic self-proclaimed DIVA (Definitely Inspired Victoriously Anointed).






