

"Calling All Poets" is held regularly on the first Wednesday of the month and is hosted by poet, musician, music therapist, and educator Victoria Muñoz.


#### **BOOK TALK & SIGNING**

Your Silas Bronson Library card gives you access to more than two dozen free and reduced price admission passes for museums, zoos, aquariums, and state parks.

Most passes can be printed directly from any computer; some require that you come to the library to pick up and return the pass. If you don't have a computer or printer, we'll be happy to print out the pass for you at the Reference Desk in the Main Reading Room.

We will use only your first name when we share your story. We will use your image only if you send us a photo of yourself. If you prefer to remain anonymous, just let us know, and we will not share your name or image with the public.
