LIBRARY REOPENING SOON

Thanks to a grant from Governor Lamont's Everybody Learns Initiative, we have been making upgrades to our buildings which will allow us to safely reopen all spaces to the public. Touchless faucets and dryers have been installed in public bathrooms, easy-to-disinfect tables with electrical and USB outlets have been installed in the Main Reading Room, and Plexiglas barriers have been installed to increase safety. Additionally, we have a large supply of hand sanitizer and disinfecting wipes for patrons to use at the library, as well as extra surgical masks for those in need of one.

As of late February, we are still waiting for a few more supplies to arrive. Once everything is in place, we will make a public announcement that we are fully open. Until then, you may still pick up books and use the computers by appointment. Call us at 203-574-8225 to schedule your appointment.

VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE (VITA) PROGRAM

Free tax prep is available through VITA for individuals who generally make \$57,000 or less, persons with disabilities, and limited English speaking taxpayers who need assistance in preparing their own tax returns. Free tax prep assistance is also available for individuals who are self-employed and should have business expenses less than \$25,000. IRS-trained



volunteers are certified to prepare simple tax returns and screen customers for special tax credits and savings plans.

Due to the pandemic situation, multiple appointments may be required for individuals to drop off their documents and then to return to receive their completed tax returns. Appointments for free tax prep assistance at the library or at any other location must be scheduled by calling 211, press option 3 and then press option 6.

VITA is made possible through a partnership with United Way of Greater Waterbury, the Connecticut Association for Human Services, and the Internal Revenue Service.

EBOOKS & AUDIOBOOKS

We have increased our collection of online books, both ebooks and downloadable audiobooks. You can access them for free with the barcode number on your library card.

You can adjust an ebook's font size, book layout, and lighting. As you read, you can also add bookmarks, create notes, highlight passages, and define words.

For audiobooks, you can skip backward or forward, increase playback speed up to 3x, and set a sleep timer until the end of the chapter or for 5, 10, 30 minutes, or more.
